
ost villagers in Ko lack stable employment or the skills and equipment necessary to make a viable living. Diseases carried by mosquitos remain a major problem and there is also a need for medical equipment and supplies for the local medical clinic.

That's why the Bath Rotary Club is teaming with the Rotary Foundation, the Rotary Club of Bolgatanga, Ghana, Rotary Clubs of District 7120 in New York State, and individual donors to make a significant difference in the health and economic well-being of the people of Ko.

State. Since his arrival in the US, Fr. Peter's ministry has extended far beyond the parishes he has served in Steuben County towns of Bath and Hornell. His gentle, effective ministry has made an impact on entire communities. Although now a US citizen, Fr. Peter continues to return home to the Village of Ko, a community so remote and impoverished that most of its residents have no electricity, running water or public sanitation.

Throughout the years, Father Peter has donated a substantial portion of his priestly income to assist African girls from his village and beyond to get the education that their parents cannot afford. Education is the primary way out of poverty for girls in Ghana who may otherwise be "married off" at a young age by their impoverished parents.
